Board of Education Public Meeting Minutes June 29, 2023

A public meeting of the Board of Education was held in hybrid format on June 29, 2023. Some Board Members, select staff, and some registered speakers participated in-person, while others participated remotely. Members of the general public who did not attend in-person participated via Zoom meeting platform.

The meeting was convened at 4:00 p.m.,Reginald L. Streater Esquire, President. President Streater asked that the Board and members of the public take a moment of silence to acknowledge and honor students in our school community who have tragically lost their lives to gun violence this year.

Following the moment of silence, President Streater reported and commented on the following:

- Recognizing June as Gun Violence Awareness Month, President Streater shared a statement on gun violence in the city of Philadelphia and acknowledged the support the School District has received from the Mayor, City Council and the Philadelphia Police Department for measures that address safe passage to and from school;
- Recognition of Juneteenth an annual celebration to commemorate the emancipation of enslaved African-Americans in the United States;
- Recognition of June as Pride Month, a celebrating the experiences and affirming the identities of our LGBTQIA+ students, staff, parents, & family members;
- Recognition of The Class of 2023 as the first class to complete the new Commonwealth graduation requirements;
- Acknowledgment of June 14th as Flag Day and Dr. Watlington's birthday;
- Acknowledgement of Audrey Nock, a special education teacher at South Philadelphia High School for 40 years, who was named Teacher of the Month for May;
- Acknowledgement of two Seniors of the Month for May: Anika Afrin and Tysir Jones, both recent graduates of Sayre High School;
- Recognition of this year's Teachers and Seniors of the Month at a celebration here at 440;
- Expressed gratitude and recognition to members of the Board of Education who have taken the time to visit several schools this year:
- Congratulations to Board Member Leticia Egea-Hinton for being recognized by the Pennsylvania Association of Hispanic School Administrators for her long-term commitment to education, Dr. Evelyn Nunez as Administrator of the Year, and Dr. Malika Savoy-Brooks as Latino-Serving Administrator of the year at a June 8th Gala in Philadelphia;
- Announcement of the Board of Education's decision to make a change to the meeting agenda to allow student speakers after committee reports but in advance of staff presentations.

Vice President Fix-Lopez made announcements concerning recording, copyright, participation in, and viewing of the meeting.

Vice President Fix-Lopez expressed gratitude to Mayor Kenney and Philadelphia City Council for passing the City budget that supports public education in the city. Vice President Fix-Lopez expressed appreciation for the work of Pennsylvania's House Democrats who sponsored a school facilities bill that supports school facilities funding by calling for a \$250 million investment in this state budget and by restarting a state grant for school facilities projects. Last, Vice President Fix-Lopez expressed support on behalf of the Board of Education for the Cyber-Charter School Reform legislation introduced to the Pennsylvania House addressing areas of cyber charter school operations and accountability and, importantly, creates funding changes that will align cyber charter tuition costs with the costs of services they are providing. Vice President Fix-Lopez asked members of our School District community to reach out to your Pennsylvania House Representative to voice your support of this legislation.

Ms. Roach highlighted opportunities of engagement including their participation in a gun violence roundtable in October 2023, moderating the School Board's Mayoral Forum, and participation in Dr. Watlington's Superintendent Advisory Council meetings.

President Streater congratulated Student Board Representative Sophia Roach on a wonderful year serving as the Student Board Representative and on her recent graduation from The Philadelphia High School for Creative and Performing Arts and wished her well as she prepares to move on to Harvard University in the fall where she will be majoring in Government and International Relations.

President Streater invited Rudy Garcia, Hearing Officer to present to provide a presentation on the non renewal process and hearing leading to the recommendation for Item No. 104 - Southwest Leadership Academy Charter - Nonrenewal of Charter (Added 6.22.23). Mr. Garcia provided an overview of the timeline and process that has led to his decision regarding the Board of Education's decision to enter into nonrenewal proceedings for Southwest Leadership Charter School at the June 22, 2022 Board of Education Meeting. Nonrenewal was recommended June 22, 2022, which triggered nonrenewal hearings. The hearing was held over 9 days in January - February 2023. Public comment was accepted by the Board of Education during a 30-day comment period. Mr. Garcia concluded that there were found grounds for nonrenewal under the Charter School Law. Following Mr. Garcia's presentation, the Board engaged in a discussion and question and answer period on the recommendation of nonrenewal for Southwest Leadership Academy Charter.

President Streater invited Peng Chao, Acting Chief of Charter Schools to provide a presentation from the Charter Schools Office on this year's 2022 - 2023 Charter School Renewal Cohort. Mr. Chao provided an overview of the Charter School Office's renewal process highlighting the charter school performance framework, domains within the framework, and renewal options provided to the Board of Education with

respect to the Charter School Law. Mr. Chao overview of schools included in the 2022-2023 Charter School Renewal Cohort, noting that there are 19 schools included in this cohort, noting that there are 7 schools that the Charter Schools Office is recommending for Renewal with No Conditions, 7 schools that the Charter School's Office is recommending for Renewal with Conditions, and 5 schools that the Charter School's Office will look to the Board of Education for instructions on how to proceed. Mr. Chao provided an overview of each individual school. Following Mr. Chao's presentation, the Board engaged in a discussion and question and answer period on the information presented.
